



Harpers Ferry National Historical Park

The National Capital Region Network Inventory & Monitoring (NCRN I&M) program monitors forest breeding birds in Harpers Ferry National Historical Park at 20 points (see map below). Right: Yearly abundance estimates (2007-2011) for four of the most abundant species in the NCRN that occur in Harpers Ferry National Historical Park, and 12 species of conservation concern detected within Harpers Ferry National Historical Park. Highest and lowest mean values are labeled and vertical lines indicate standard errors. Four regionally abundant species remained stable. Several of the species of conservation concern have large variances and stable abundances. However, Eastern Wood-Pewee and Acadian Flycatcher abundance has increased, and Eastern Towhee abundance has decreased within the park. Left: Average Bird Community Index scores for Harpers Ferry National Historical Park(2007-2011).
